MEET TYPE

MEET THE BREEDER: JOHN DAVID ADKINS

Q: How did you develop an interest in the hobby?

My interest in exhibition poultry began when Joe Brisker, Director of the Poultry Department at the Scioto County Fair, asked my mother to take over as the Open Poultry Superintendent. The fair also paid someone to feed the birds during the fair and I took that job. I was either just out of high school or in my first year of college, which would make it the summer of 1980 or 1981. I clerked with APA Judge Bob Fleming at the fair and he told me "If you are going to keep doing this, you should get yourself a few birds to show and make a little money." He was right on the second part, I have made very little money on birds since then but had a great time!

Q: Where did you get your start in Plymouth Rocks?

I honestly am not sure where my first Partridge Rock bantams came from. I think I purchased a pair or trio at our local swap meet. As a part of getting involved in showing I also got a Murray McMurray catalog and ordered the 50 chick bantam assortment. I showed some of these birds at the Southern Ohio Poultry Association's show the next spring and learned the hard way, like so many others, that there is a world of difference in hatchery and swap quality birds and exhibition birds. The original Partridge Rocks apparently had some decent genes as the birds I raised out of them were competitive and so they have been my breed of first choice since that day. Many folks have contributed birds to my breeding program over the years and I hesitate to mention some of them because I might leave someone out. With the Partridge Rock bantams, I very much suspect that most of them trace at least some of their lineage back to Roy Whitner, who had the best I have ever seen.

Q: Who influenced or mentored you when you first started?

My original mentors in Plymouth Rocks were Tim Bowles, Hugh Barnett, Carl Fosbrink, and Russell Hammann. Russell and I both showed Partridge bantams at shows in our area. He would have BV one week and I would have it the next week. Once in a great while we might even get a BB or RB. Tim, Carl, and Hugh probably taught me more about Plymouth Rock type than anyone else. Later influences were Don Cash, Shelby Harrington, Dick Horstman, Bill Krueger, Paul Monteith, and Wilbur Stauffer. Many of these people I have mentioned remain some of my best friends today. Carl and Paul were the two responsible for my being

Secretary of the Plymouth Rock Fanciers Club for many years. I think my involvement with the PRFC, the SOPA, and the ABA are what prepared me for the position of APA Secretary which I currently hold.

Q: What varieties do you raise?

I currently only have Partridge bantams but have raised Barred, Partridge, and White Large Fowl as well as Barred and Silver Pencilled bantams.

Q: What do you enjoy most about breeding and showing your Rocks?

For me it is not really about winning as I am not super competitive with the birds. It is about getting to travel to new parts of the country, meet new fellow fanciers, and visit with many of the old friends I have made over the years. I also enjoy watching my new crop of youngsters grow out each year in the hope that I have gotten a little closer to the perfect specimen.

Q: What faults do you see in the showroom that bother you when showing?

One of the biggest faults that I see concerns the Barred bantams. Carl Fosbrink and I used to go around and around about this one. Many of them, if examined closely, owe all of their length of body to the length of their tails. I also have struggled with getting good pencilling in my females. As regards the large fowl, I think that some of the whites in particular are getting too big.

Q: Tell us a little about your life outside the hobby.

My wife Melissa and I live on my family's farm in Lucasville, Ohio. Our family has owned the farm since the late 1800's and it is really the only home I have ever known. Our daughter Katelin Crute lives in Seattle, Washington and volunteers as Webmaster for the APA. My other hobby is playing tournament level Bridge. For those not familiar with it, Bridge is a card game that, after playing for more than thirty years, I am still learning! The strange thing about my two hobbies is that while both are very different, ultimately it comes down to getting points! My level of competitiveness is much greater at the Bridge table than it is in the showroom. For many years I have been judging youth and Junior Fair shows. I am a retired high school math and science teacher and very much enjoy working with youth.
